Safer Cities: Her Way 2 (the Program) is a \$15 million collaborative partnership program that supports local councils to deliver projects that aim to improve the perception of safety in public spaces and transport hub precincts for everyone, particularly women, girls and gender diverse people when walking, cycling or accessing public transport.

The Program will provide successful Applicants with funding under two tiers:

- Tier 1: On-the-ground projects can apply for \$1 million.
- Tier 2: Strategic projects can apply for \$150,000.

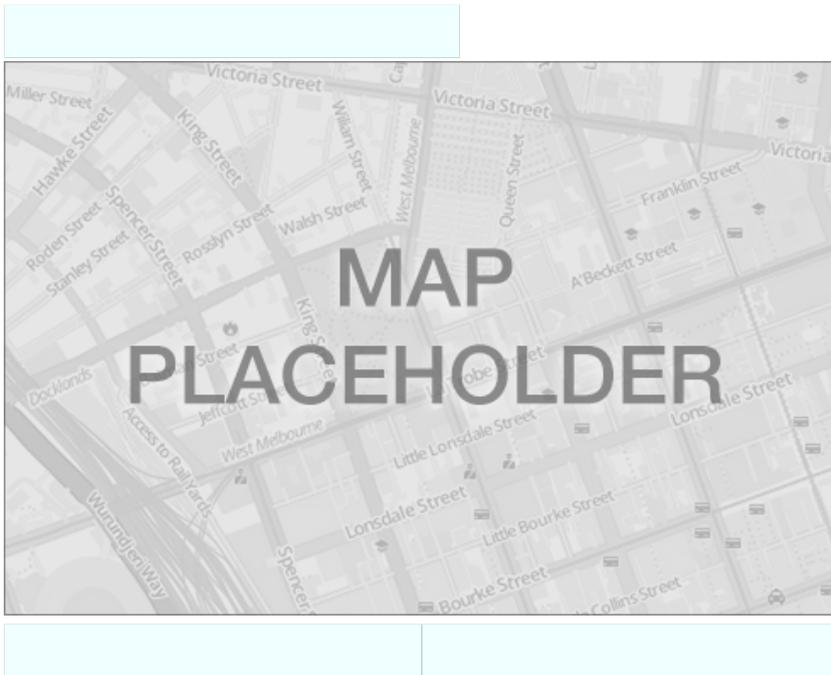

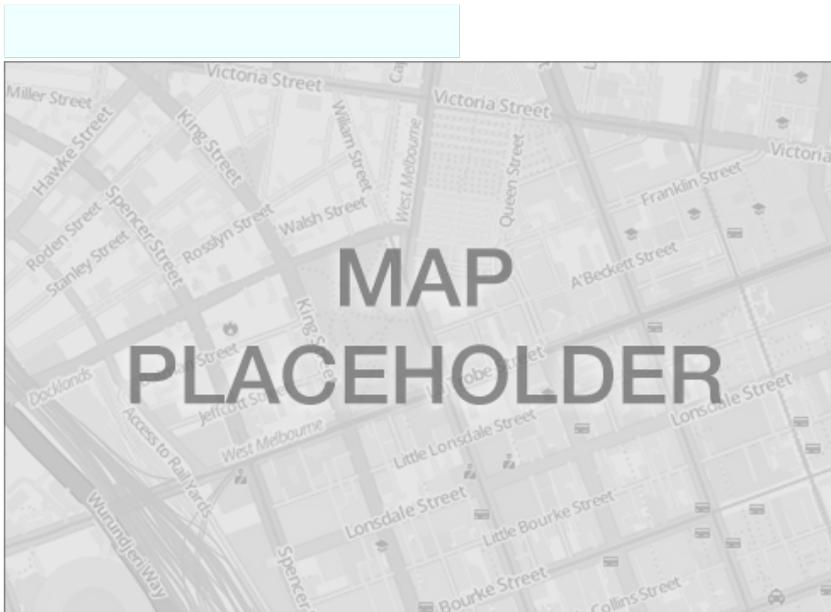
